Liturgy of Initiation

Presentation of the Candidates

The bishop asks the candidates:

Have you been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit?

I have.

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

I am.

The bishop addresses the whole congregation:

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome these candidates and uphold them in their life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

The bishop invites the candidates to renew their baptism vows.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? **I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ? **I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? I submit to Christ as Lord.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? **I come to Christ.**

The bishop says

May God, who has given you the desire to follow Christ, give you also strength to continue in the Way. **Amen.**

Blessing of the Font

The ministers and candidates process to the baptismal font, families and friends of the candidates and any children are invited to follow, and we stand and turn in our seats to face them.

The bishop says

Father, we thank you that through the waters of Baptism we die to sin and are made new in Christ. Grant through your Spirit that those baptized here may enjoy the liberty and splendour of the children of God.

There is one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism; One God and Father of all.

We dedicate this Font in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The bishop prays over the water:

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, sovereign God of all, to you be glory and praise for ever. You are our light and our salvation. From the deep waters of death you have raised your Son to life in triumph. Grant that all who have been born anew by water and the Spirit, may daily be renewed in your image, walk by the light of faith, and serve you in newness of life; through your anointed Son, Jesus Christ, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit we lift our voices of praise. Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Blessed be God for ever.

Profession of Faith

The bishop addresses the whole congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life,

the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

As we have professed our faith in God, let us be renewed by the water of baptism, that this place of prayer – including our new extension – and we, God's people who gather here, would be washed clean and made ready to receive the gifts of God.

The bishop sprinkles the candidates, the congregation, and the threshold of the new extension with the water of baptism. The candidates are invited to sign themselves with water from the font.

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all who have been baptized into your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The bishop, ministers, and candidates gather at the place of confirmation.

Confirmation

The bishop stands before those who are to be confirmed, and says

Our help is in the name of the Lord who has made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord **now and for ever. Amen.**

The bishop extends his hands towards those to be confirmed and prays:

Almighty and ever-living God, you have given these your servants new birth in baptism by water and the Spirit, and have forgiven them all their sins. Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding; the Spirit of counsel and inward strength; the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord. **Amen.**

The bishop addresses each candidate by name, and anoints them on the forehead with the oil of chrism.

N, God has called you by name and made you his own.

The bishop then lays his hand on the head of each, saying

Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The bishop invites the congregation to pray for the candidates:

Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace, that they may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until they come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

The bishop introduces the Peace.

God has made us one in Christ. He has set his seal upon us and, as a pledge of what is to come, has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

The congregation greet the newly confirmed with a round of applause! We exchange a sign of peace.

We gather at God's table to worship Christ our Lord, the one who calls and keeps us, exalted and adored.

O hear the saints and angels: we join with them in song, whose voices carry sweetly from the land where we belong.

Draw near, where earth and heaven converge in bread and wine, and, bold, our church bears witness to Christ in space and time. The stones themselves, they echo with prayers of pilgrims past, the tale of God's own people of which we all are part.

So let our hearts be lifted, with joy this house resound; the choice of we, the chosen, is given shape and sound as, hands outstretched, our longing is met with gift and grace: the body of our saviour incarnate in this place.

Be present, Holy Spirit, pour out on us your love that fires, enfolds, and frees us to lift our eyes above.

Take these the gifts we offer - our bodies, souls, and selves - and with them build a temple fit for our God to dwell.



Giving of Communion

God's holy gifts for God's holy people. Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

This is God's table and all are welcome. Please follow the directions of the steward. Those sitting towards the front will be invited to come forwards first. If you are sitting on the south side (to the right of the aisle when facing the altar), please let people out of your pew first and make your way back round via the north aisle and central aisle. If you are sitting on the north side (to the left of the aisle when facing the altar), please come straight out of your pew and come back via the north aisle.

There are two stations for the bread at the Chancel step: please use whichever is available, then return to your seat via the North Aisle. The chalice is being administered from the Lady Chapel step.

If you are wearing a mask, it is most practical if you remove it before receiving communion. Please do not dip your wafer into the chalice. Please note that there is no obligation to take the chalice and it is fine still to receive communion in one kind only (the bread).

If you do not wish to receive communion and would prefer a blessing instead, please do come forwards as well.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people, loving your neighbour as yourself? With the help of God, I will.

Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society? by prayer for the world and its leaders, by defending the weak, and by seeking peace and justice? **With the help of God, I will.**

Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth?

With the help of God, I will.

May Christ dwell in your hearts through faith, that you may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit. **Amen.**
